Manhasset Public Schools' 2015 Red Ribbon Week Substance Abuse Prevention Celebration is scheduled from Saturday, October 10<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, October 18<sup>th</sup>. Red Ribbon Week is a national campaign observed to help children make healthy and responsible choices in the prevention of substance abuse. This year's theme, *Box Out Bullying & Drugs*, reinforces the importance of our children being kind to each other and making healthy choices.

Please join us in celebration by tying a red ribbon around your door or tree so we can unite the Manhasset community to promote the health and safety of our children. Also, we remind all community residents to rid their homes of unwanted or expired medications in the prevention of teen prescription drug abuse at our local take back events (*see attached Town of North Hempstead S.T.O.P. Event Flyer*) or at the Nassau County Police Community Center at 100 Community Drive, Manhasset. The disposal bin is located in the lobby and can be accessed 24/7.

Each student/family will receive a parent outreach letter, educational resource and a red ribbon *to exhibit at home* in support of being kind and living healthy.



All students will be provided with a personal 2015 Red Ribbon Week armband that they may wear throughout the week as a symbol of their commitment to being kind and making healthy choices in life.


# Get the free app that can prevent bullying.

#### How can I help a child affected by bullying?

Talking with your child every day is an easy way to stay connected. Research shows that spending at least 15 minutes a day talking with your child will increase self-esteem and encourage him/her to come to you with a problem. This will help your child face bullying—whether being bullied, engaging in bullying, or witnessing bullying.

#### How can the KnowBullying app help prevent bullying?

The KnowBullying app helps you make the most of each opportunity to talk by giving helpful reminders and conversation starters. It provides information on bullying including how to know if your child is being affected and how to stop it. KnowBullying by SAMHSA also provides strategies for educators and school administrators.

Join your community and clean out your medicine cabinet of any prescription or over-the counter drugs that may be expired, unused or unwanted. Discard these items in an environmentally safe manner while protecting your kids!

#### Instructions:

- · Keep all medications in their original containers
- Block out the name for anonymity --- Do not cross out medication information
- · Illegal drugs may also be dropped off anonymously

#### ACCEPTED NOT ACCEPTED

Prescription medications (controlled & uncontrolled)	Sharps (e.g. needles and Syringes)
All over-the-counter medications	IV bags
Medication samples	Bloody or infectious waste
Pet Medications	Pharmaceutical waste not generated by households (e.g., clinics, pharmacies, hospitals, doctors, etc.)
