

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Manhasset CASA's Goals

- I. Reduce Substance Abuse among youth and, over time, among adults;
 - Reduce all underage drinking, including binge drinking;
 - Delay the onset of initial use of alcohol;
 - Reduce other drug use including marijuana, prescription drugs, inhalants and tobacco.
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Manhasset CASA's Goals(cont'd)

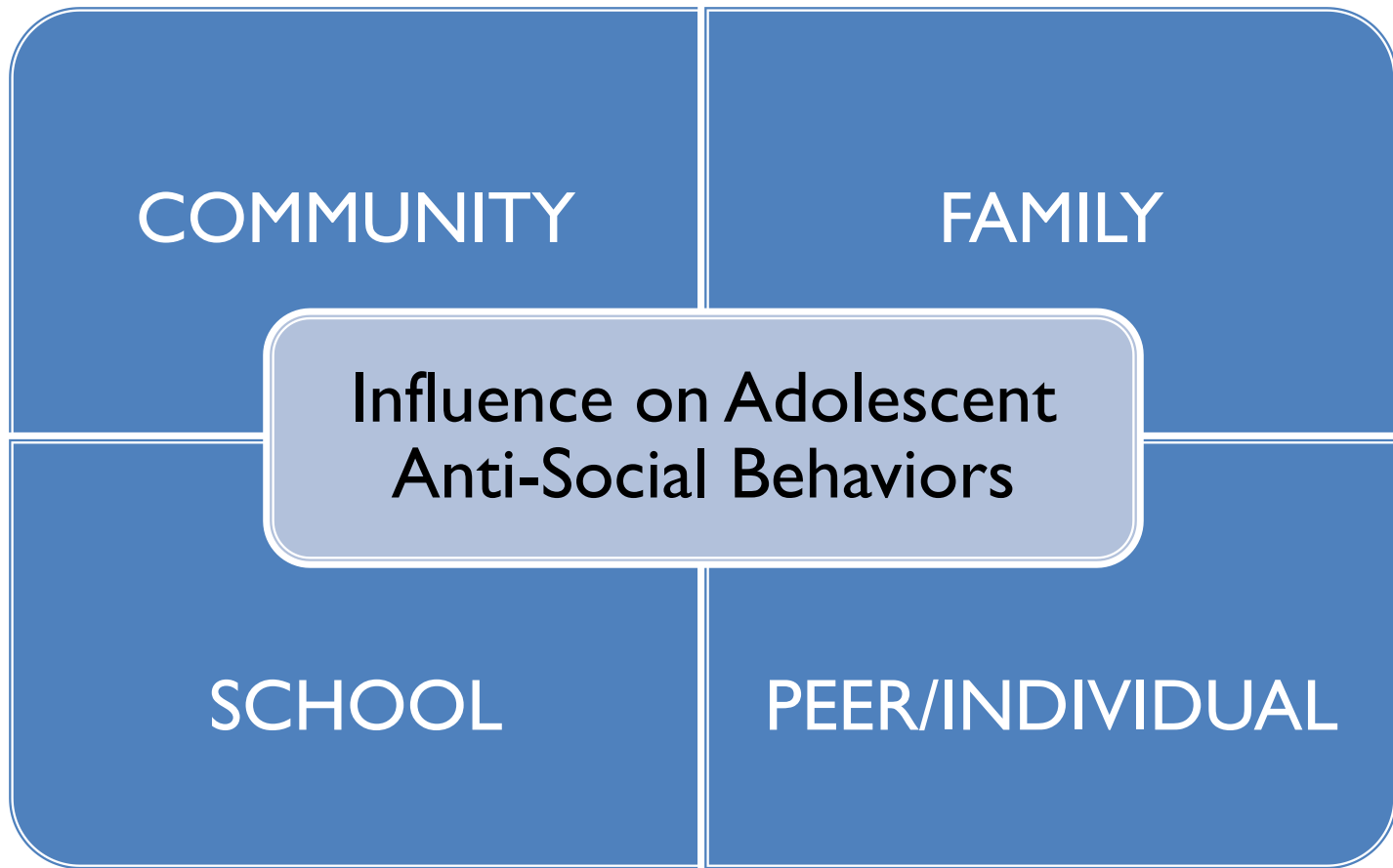
2. Establishing and strengthening collaboration within the community to prevent and reduce substance abuse among youth.

Strategic Prevention Framework

- ▶ Based upon epidemiological research that has identified **RISK** and **PROTECTIVE** factors that lead to problem behaviors during adolescence including substance abuse;
 - *Guidance in developing framework and achieving goals*

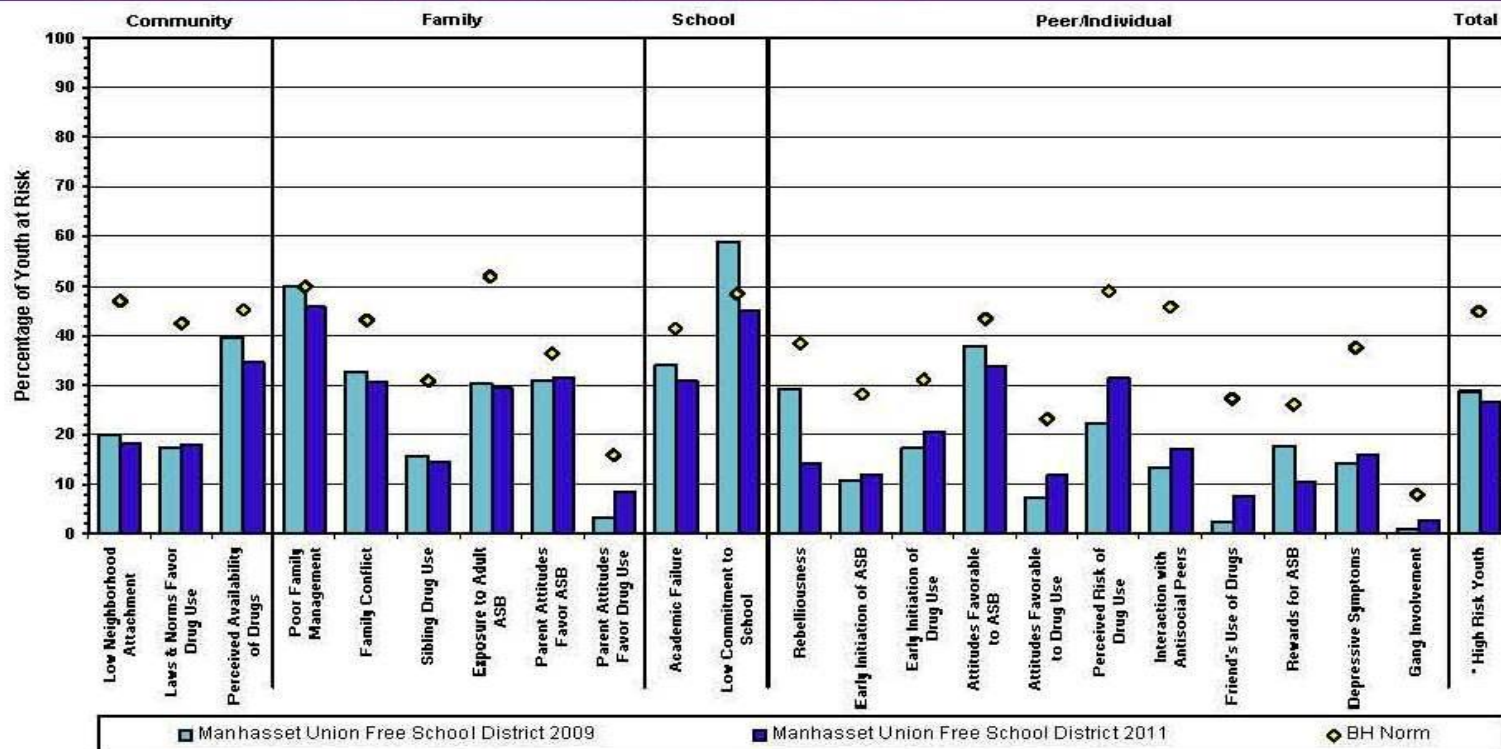
Risk & Protective Factors

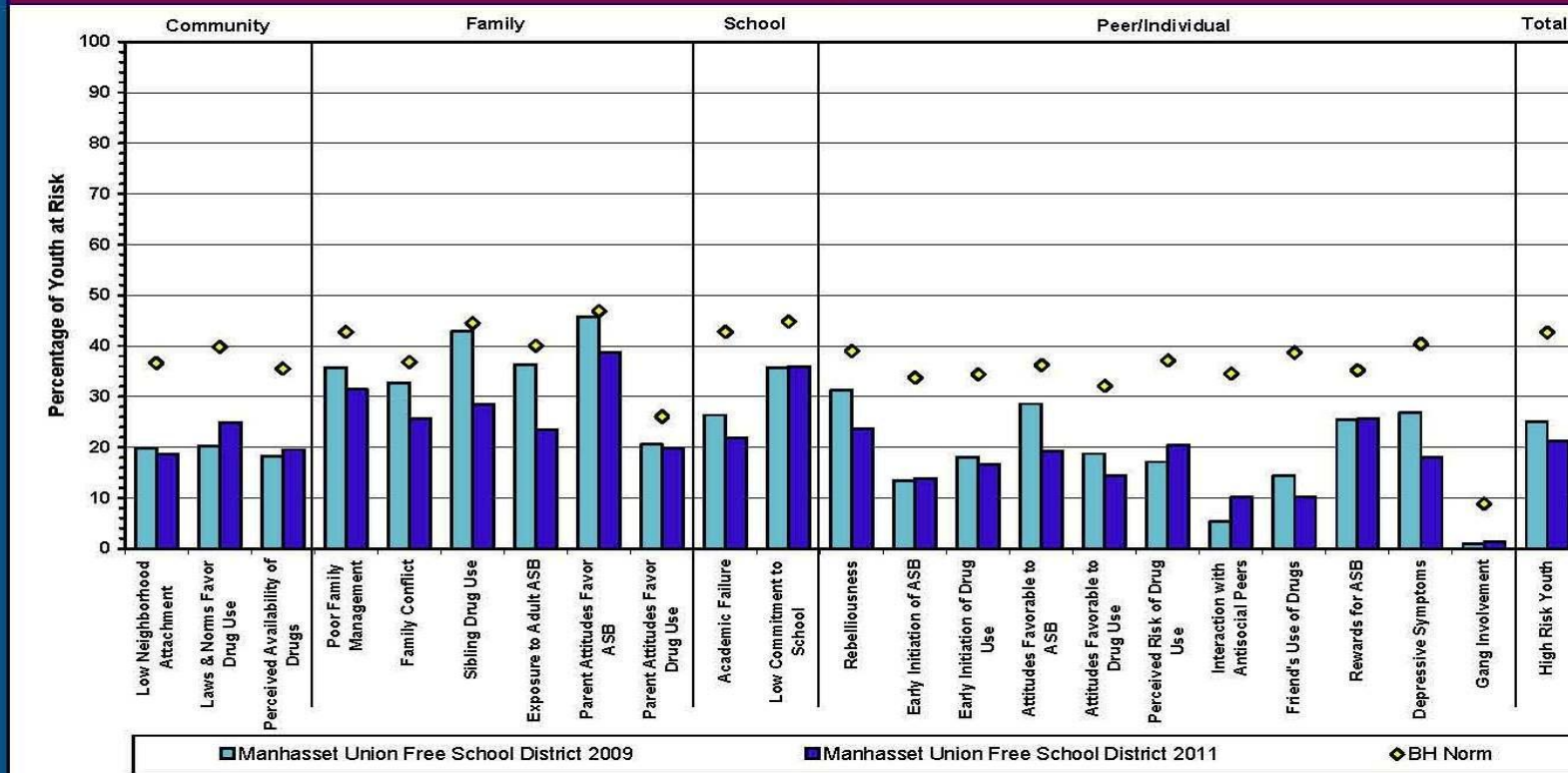

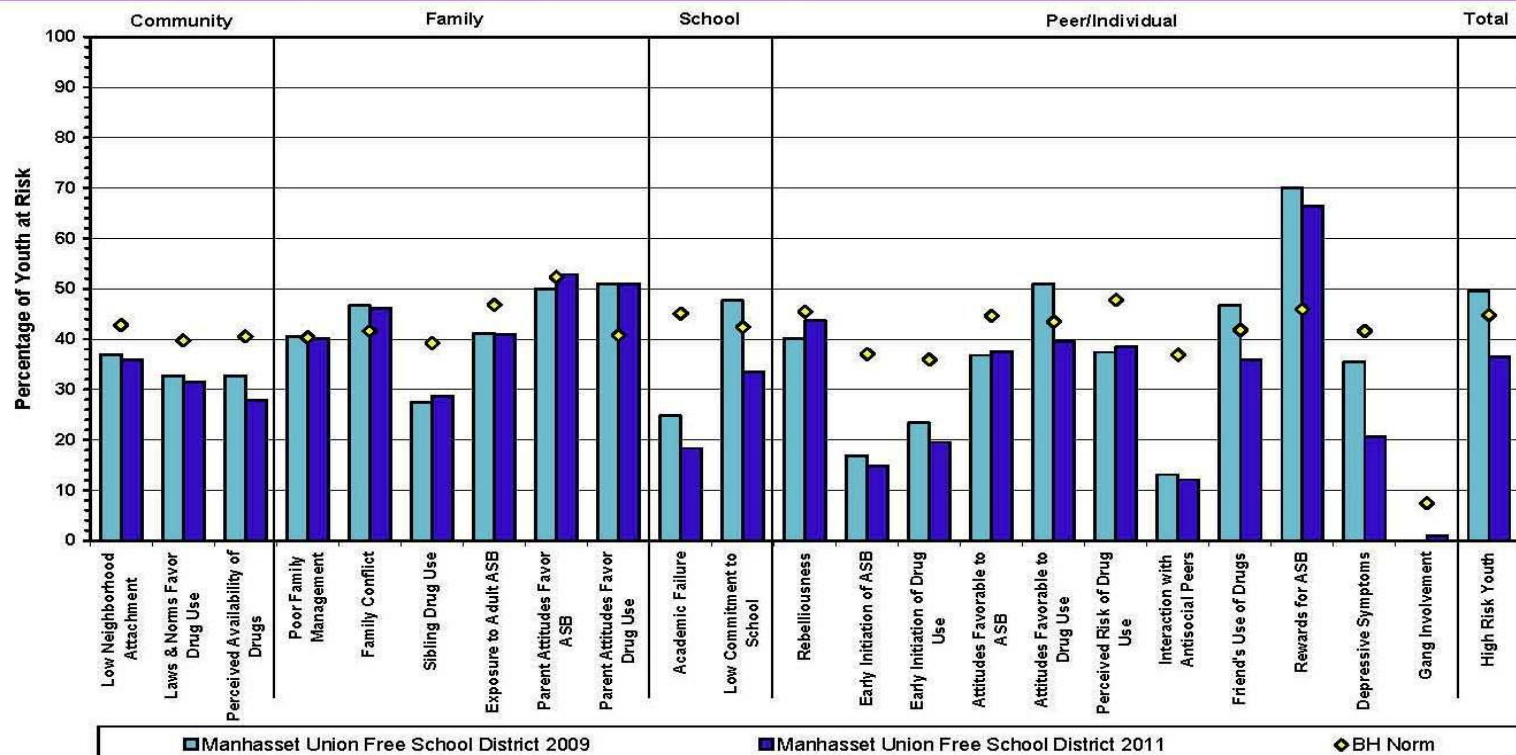


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MPS 10th Grade RISK Factor Profile

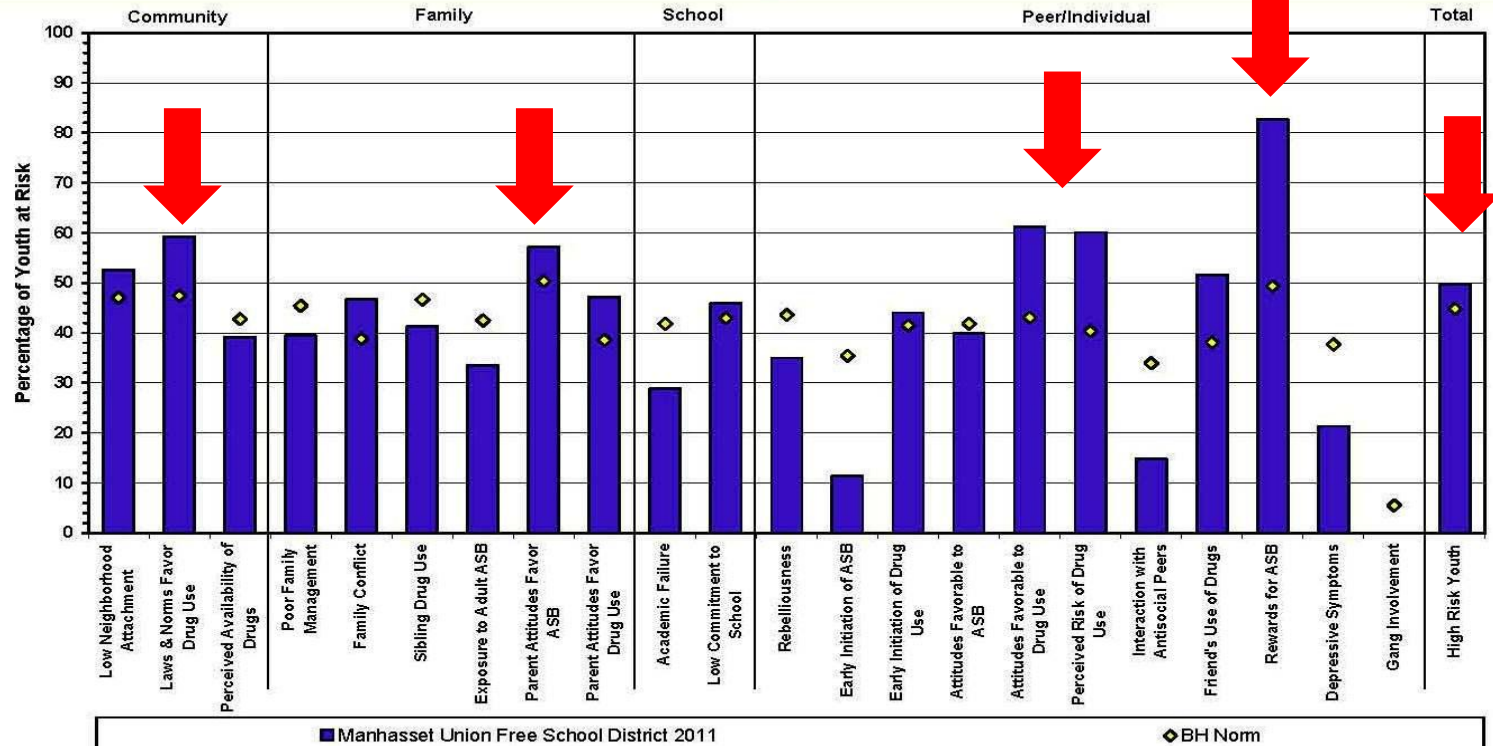


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MPS 12th Grade RISK Factor Profile

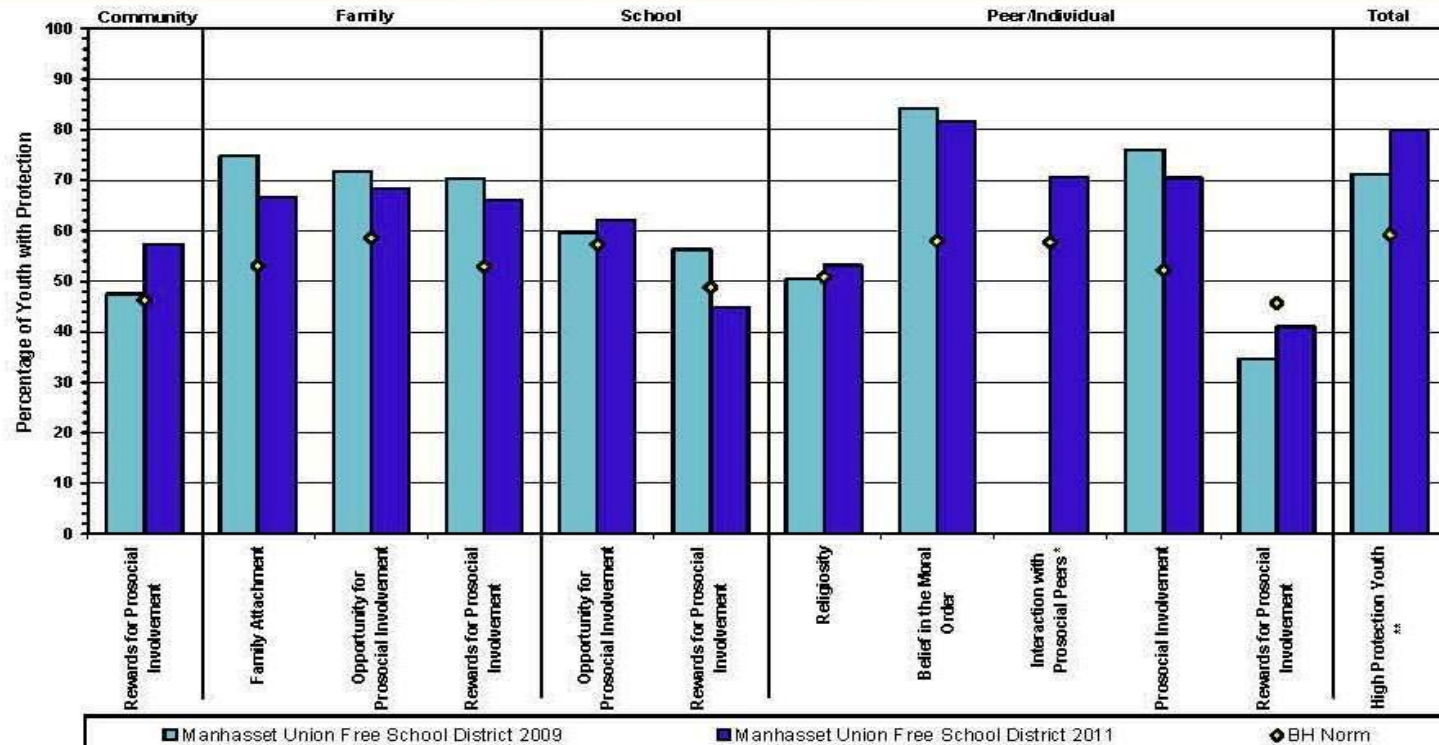


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MPS 6th Grade Protective Factor Profile

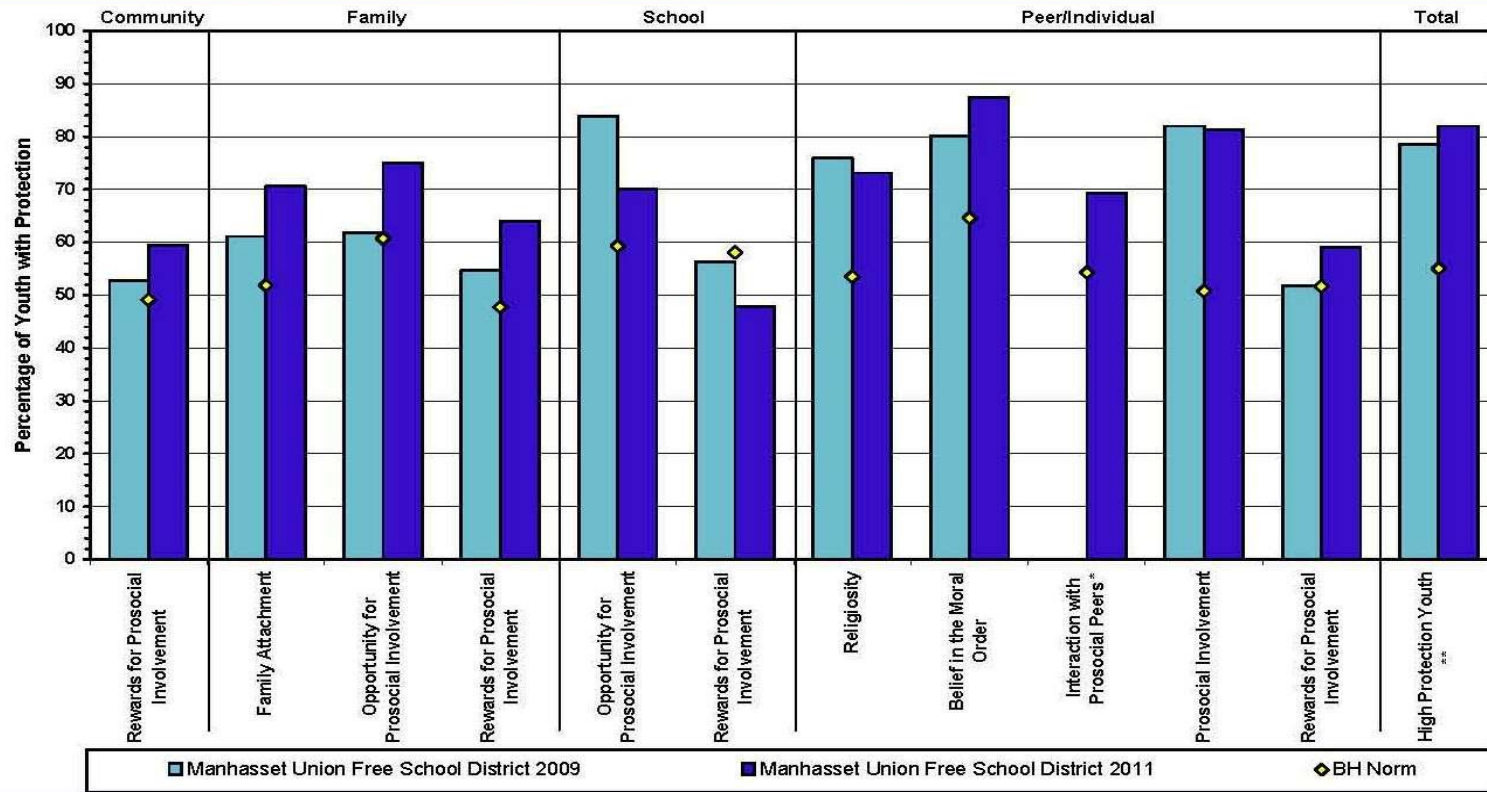

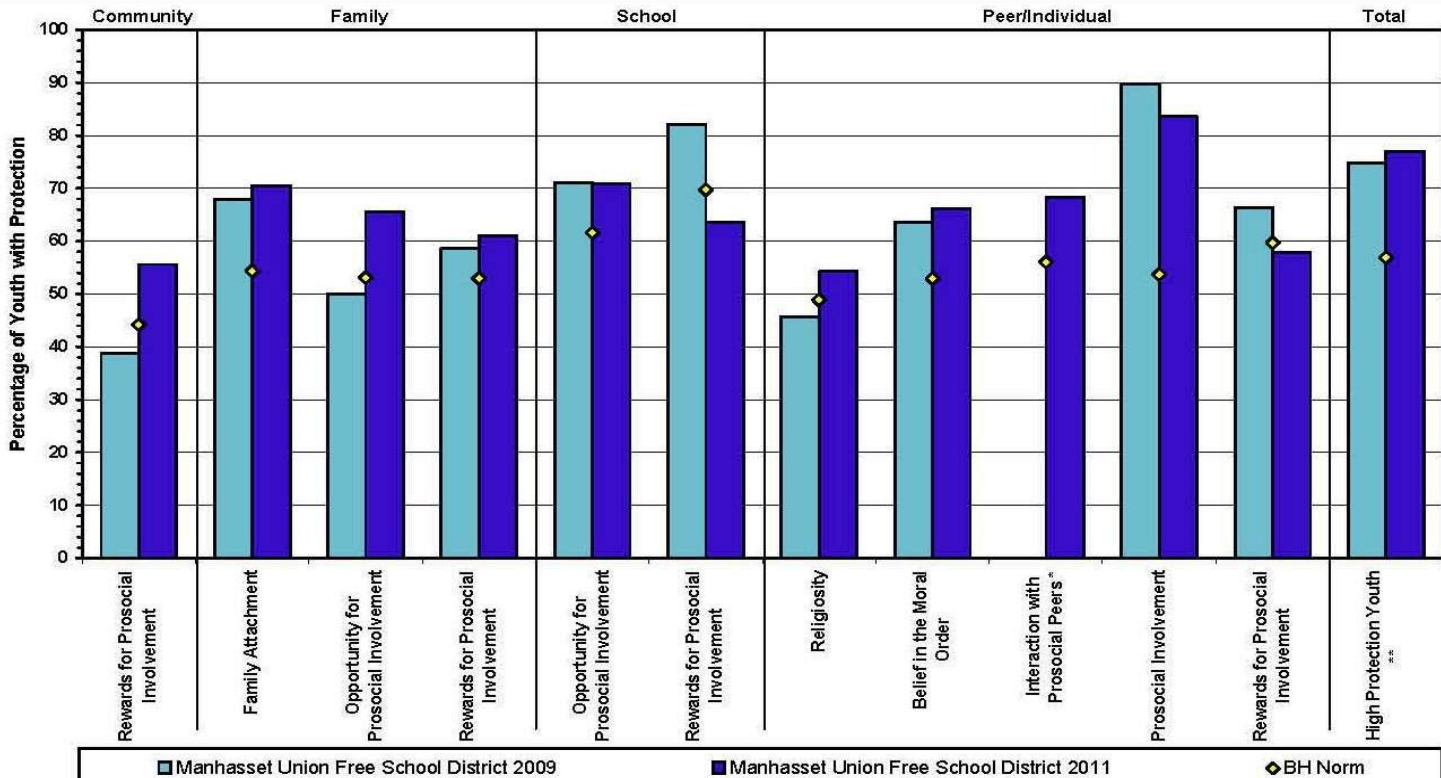


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MPS 10th Grade Protective Factor Profile

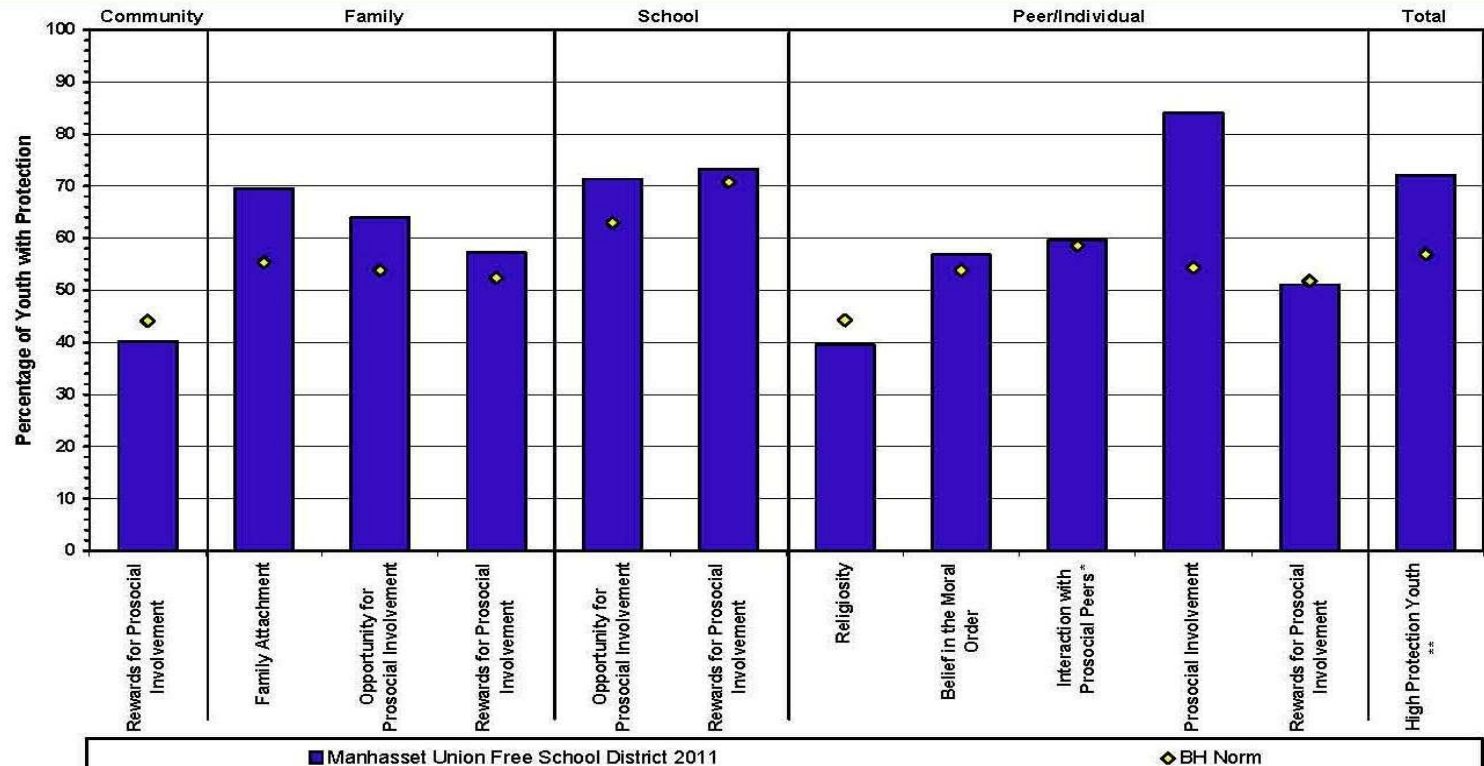


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MPS 12th Grade Protective Factor Profile

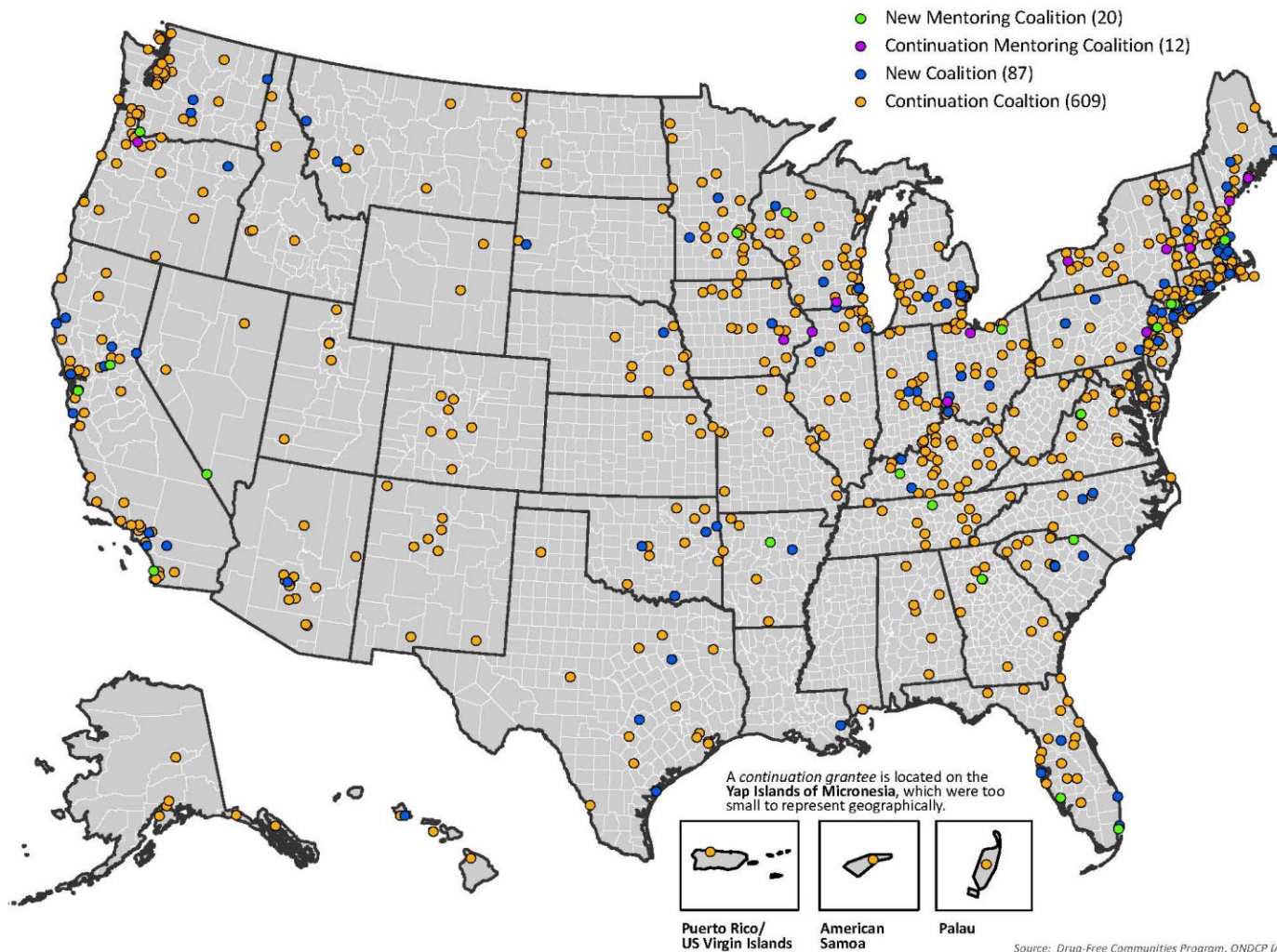
