Richard Clarke's name is synonymous with both Cyber Security and Counter-terrorism. He was the first ever Special Advisor on Cyberspace Security to the president of the United States and wrote the National Plan for Cyber Security (for President Clinton) and the National Strategy to Secure Cyberspace (for President Bush 43). On Counter-terrorism, Clarke was the senior U.S. government official under three presidents (Bush, Clinton, Bush) over the course of an unprecedented eleven years of continuous White House service. He was one of the first officials to identify the threat from al Qaeda and to plan and direct actions against it. He was the national crisis manager on 9-11.
