Turning Lane In Springtime

Town of North Hempstead residents and officials hoped the creation of a turning lane at Manhasset Avenue and Plandome Road would be in place before the school year commenced. Now, they are hoping that the two-lane Manhasset Avenue—and the congestion that comes with it—will be things of the past by springtime.

Town spokesman Collin Nash said the project exited the planning stage and entered the construction stage in October, when an unutilized police booth on the southwest side of the intersection was removed.

Soon thereafter new utility poles were installed further south on Plandome Road in order to relocate wires from the intersection and remove poles that would block construction of the new lane, said Town spokesman Ryan Mulholland. These wires facilitate electricity, Nassau County traffic signals, and Verizon and Cablevision operations.

This set the stage for construction crews to widen Manhasset Avenue enough to fit an additional lane, dedicated to drivers turning right onto the southbound portion of Plandome Road.

The Town is now awaiting Nassau County approval for an upgrade to the intersection's traffic signal, Mulholland said, but construction will not commence until the

springtime due to the weather-dependent nature of concrete work and asphalt paving.

Some residents blame funding removal as the culprit for this delay. Mulholland declined to comment on the possibility and Rich Bentley, an original conceptualizer of the six-year-old project, said he chalks it up to a rumor.

"We're dealing with inter-municipal affairs and they are always time consuming, they're always frustrating in that they get delayed, but there's nothing that we can do other than wait for the approval to happen," said Bentley, who also serves as the president of the Council of Greater Manhasset Civic Associations, Inc.

"Patience is a virtue, when you're dealing with government."
