CASA Meeting Discusses Member Collaboration

Positive Alternatives for teens

At Manhasset CASA's recent sector meeting, the Long Island Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence presented an overview of the current substance abuse outlook on Long Island highlighting the role community members can play to help our teens grow up healthy. Dr. Jeffrey Reynolds, executive director, LI-CADD, discussed the necessity for collaborative solutions when it comes to youth substance abuse

and risk behaviors, "To tackle underage drinking and the opiate epidemic, all of us have to be a part of the solution to develop innovative approaches to helping our teens," stated Reynolds.

Community collaboration is the foundation of Manhasset CASA and is vital to reducing substance use among teens. Since 2001, the Manhasset Community coalition Against Substance Abuse (CASA) has existed in the Manhasset community as a resource to reduce the illegal, underage use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs among its youth. As a recipient of the Office of National Drug Control Policy's Drug Free Communities Grant Program, CASA works with key sectors from the community: Manhasset Public Schools, Manhasset SCA, Manhasset SADD, Manhasset Clergy Association, Manhasset Chamber of Commerce, Manhasset Great Neck EOC, The Manhasset Press, LICADD, Long Island Volunteer Center, Nassau County Police De-

partment Sixth Precinct, Nassau County Division of Chemical Dependency, Town of North Hempstead, Nassau County Legislature and the Tobacco Action Coalition of Long Island.

"The Manhasset Community's support is really essential to our mission. Our kids love our neighborhoods, schools and community and with this positive attachment, we can reduce teen substance abuse by increasing positive alternatives for our teens," stated Lisbeth Shibley, Manhasset CASA executive director and president. The 2011 Bach Harrison Prevention Needs Assessment Survey indicates that a majority of Manhasset Public School teens have a positive neighborhood attachment. Research shows that youth who like the neighborhoods in which they live and have more opportunities for pro-social involvement are less likely to become involved with risk behaviors and drug use.


