
Popular Doc To Give Manhasset Straight Dope On Drugs

He's back by popular demand. On Thursday, Jan. 30 at 7:30 p.m. at Manhasset High School, Dr. Stephen Dewey of the Feinstein Institute for Medical Research at North Shore LIJ will candidly present "the facts...and just the facts" as to how alcohol and drugs affect the teen brain.

Dewey's parent and youth presentation, "This is Your Teen's Brain," is held in coordination with Manhasset CASA and National Drug Facts Week, which runs from Monday, Jan. 27 through Friday, Jan. 31.

Dewey, Manhasset CASA's "secret weapon" when it comes to dispelling myths about underage drinking and drug use, has appeared often on television, including on 20/20, Dateline, and Good Morning America, and the major networks.

"We are so fortunate to have Dr. Dewey dedicate his time and energy in Manhasset to offer all of us the understanding of how underage

drinking and drug use can have short and long-lasting health consequences for our teens," said Lisa Belinsky, executive director of Manhasset CASA. "And it is both students and parents that continue to request this presentation."
