The suit fit perfectly with a pillow tied around my belly. The hat with beard attached looked great. I pulled up the boots and was almost ready to go when

one of the ladies took me aside and rubbed my cheeks and nose with a dose of rouge. That was a finishing touch. One of the residents in Munsey Park, who owned an auto dealership, provided a convertible with sound system to play Christmas Carols for the ride through the village of the site where Santa

My daughter, Wendy, was six years old; she came with friends to see Santa. Her friends were surprised when Santa greeted them by name. After the line of children vanished, our convertible took us to the home of a bedridden youngster to deliver a little gift of good cheer. For the

two succeeding years we again did the "Santa visit" but instead of a convertible auto, a fire engine led the cavalcade to the point on Bellows Lane where Christmas joy took place.
