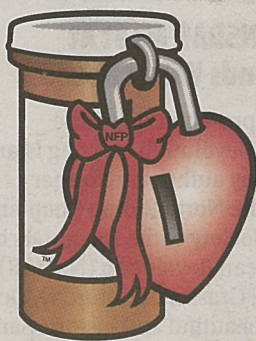

- Block out the name for anonymity --- Do not cross out medication information
- Illegal drugs may also be dropped off anonymously

ACCEPTED

Prescription medications (controlled & uncontrolled)
All over-the-counter medications
Medication samples
Pet Medications
Vitamins & Supplements
Medicated ointments, lotions, creams & oils
Inhalers
Liquid Medication
Homeopathic Remedies
Suppositories

NOT ACCEPTED

Sharps (e.g. needles and Syringes)
IV bags
Bloody or infectious waste
Pharmaceutical waste not generated by households (e.g., clinics, pharmacies, hospitals, doctors, etc.)
Radioactive pharmaceuticals
Vaccines
