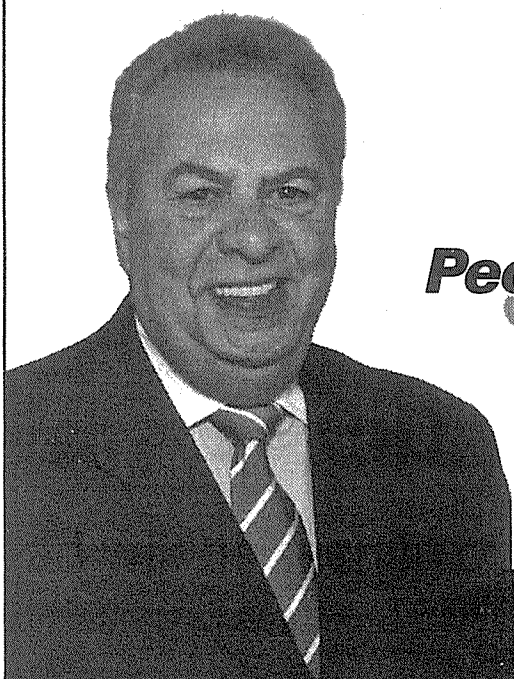

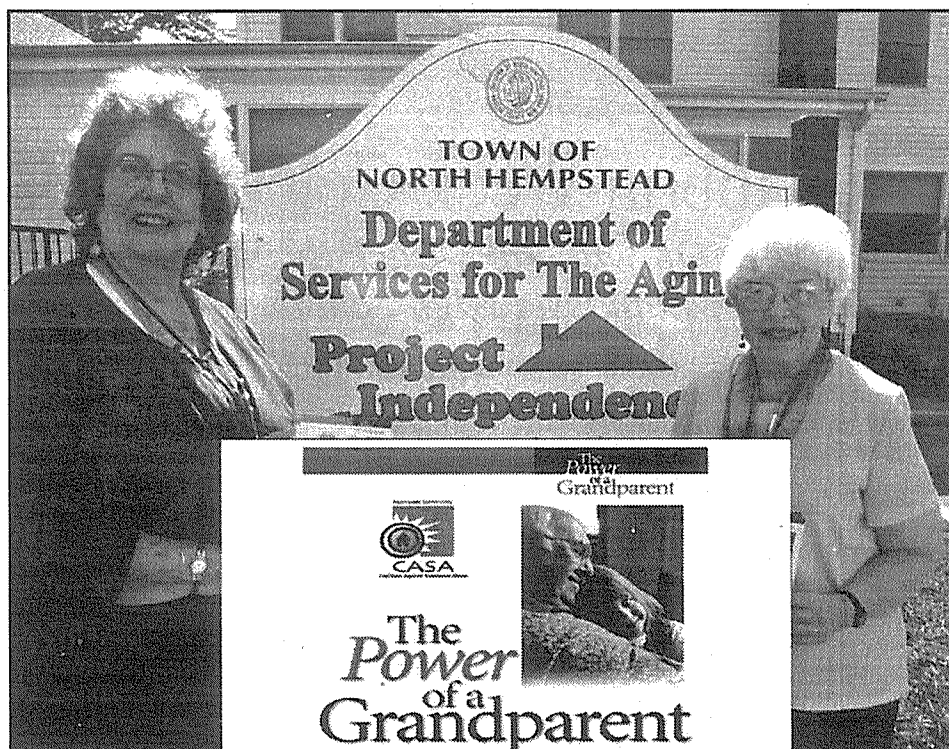

As part of its Lock Your Meds Be Aware Don't Share Campaign, Manhasset CASA will discuss with Evelyn Roth, commissioner of the Town of North Hempstead's Department of Services for the Aging, the steps to take in our homes to safeguard medication as well as how grandparents can be a powerful influence in the lives of their grandchildren when it comes to substance abuse. Of those teens who abuse prescription drugs, 70 percent get their prescription drugs from friends and family.

In its efforts to combat teen prescription drug misuse, Manhasset CASA is again collaborating with the National Family Partnership, Manhasset Public Schools,

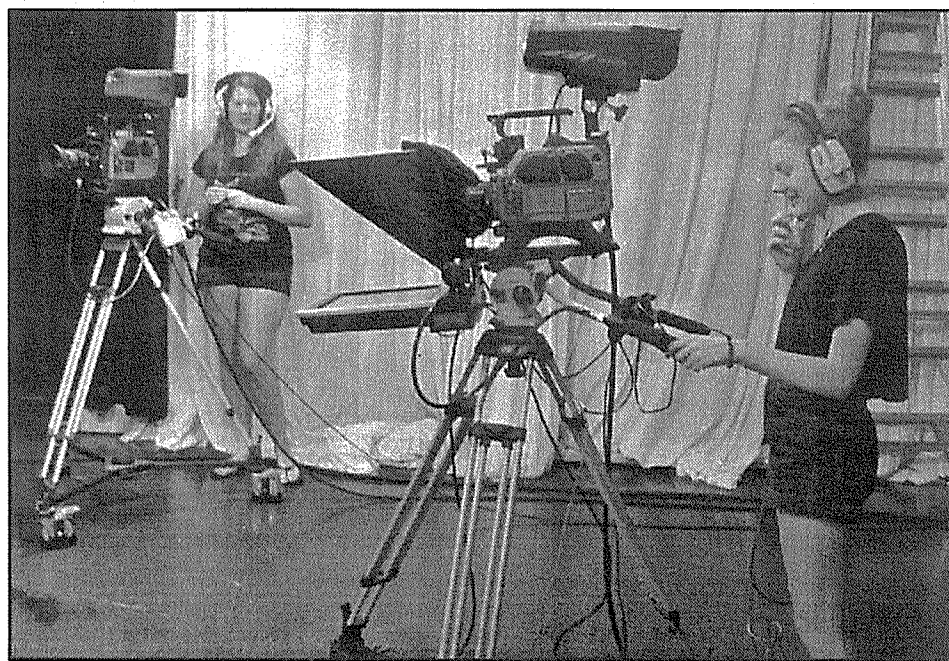
