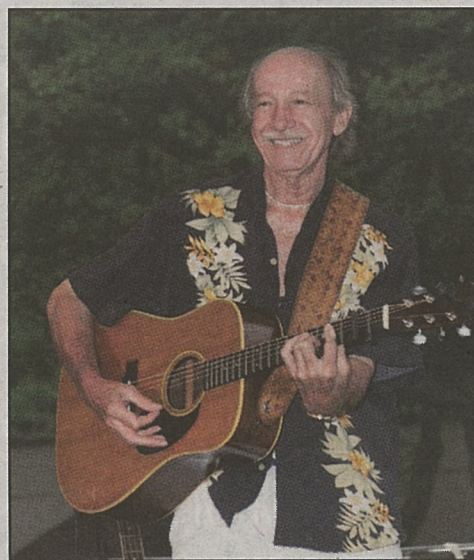
Famous Singer And Songwriter to Perform Benefit Concert in Manhasset
