The week's activities highlighted the theme "Friends don't let friends bully or do drugs" and featured outstanding anti-bullying programs by Theatre Three of Port Jefferson.

Stand-Up! Stand Out! The **Bullying Project** educated K-3 students about the importance of being an "upstander" when faced with bullying peer situations. The production modeled how students can take responsibility beyond

themselves and included different ways the main character could help another character who was experiencing bullying. Actors explained the difference between tattling and telling; tattling is to get someone into trouble and telling is to get someone out of trouble. In addition, the play identified four different types of bullying: name calling and teasing, social isolation, threats and physical bullying.

Class Dismissed: The Bullying Project reinforced with students in grades 4-6 that they have the power to acknowledge acts of bullying, address them, and stop their progress. The program highlighted how students are the solution and how they can
