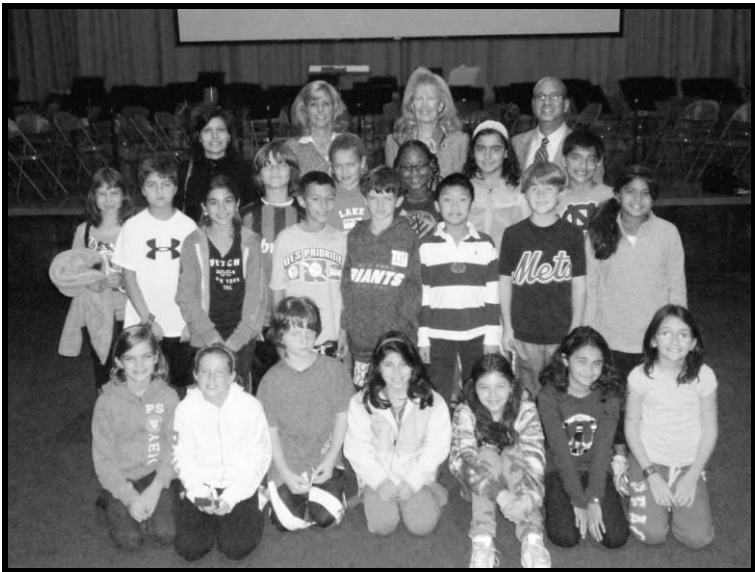
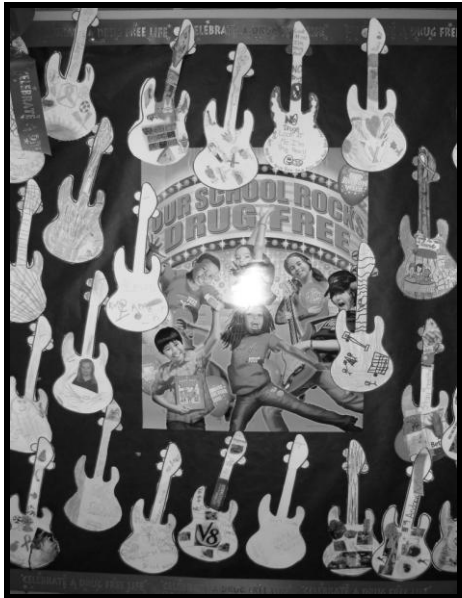


Around Manhasset Schools
