Over half of adolescents and teens have been bullied online,

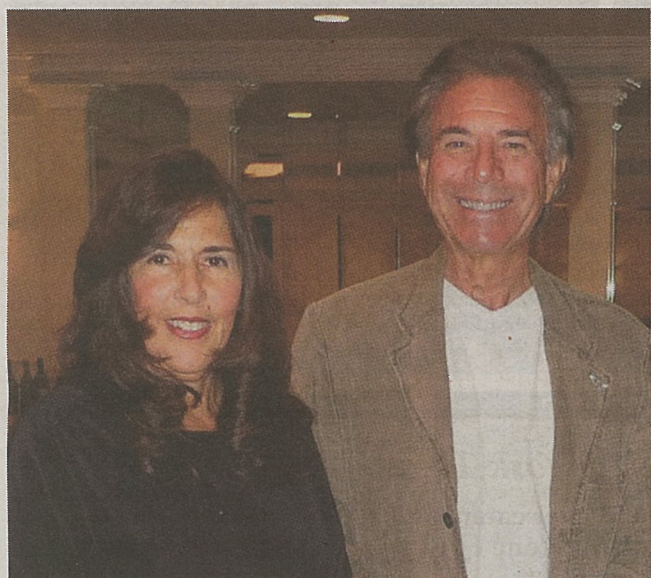
and about the same number have engaged in cyber bullying.
