Gifted/Talented Programming

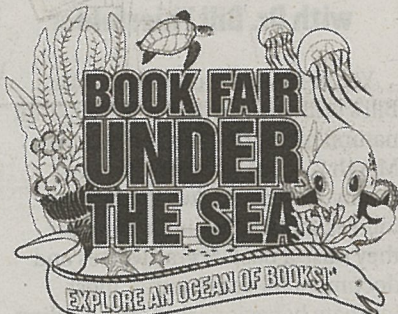
