Key messages of Manhasset CASA's Safe Medicine Practices include:

• Only use prescription medications to prevent others from taking them,

as directed by a health professional

• Never share prescription medications with others or use someone else's prescription medications

Always store medications securely prevent others from taking them.

and properly dispose of medications that you no longer need

• Be a good example to those around you by modeling these safe medication-taking practices and discussing the dangers of misusing prescription drugs with your family, friends, colleagues, students or patients.

According to the 2016 Surgeon General's Report on Alcohol, Drugs and Health, more than 47,000 people died from a drug overdose in 2014, and nearly 30,000 of these deaths involved prescription drugs. From 2000 to 2015 more than half a million people died from drug overdoses. In addition, 91 Americans die every day from an opioid overdose (CDC). In 2015, 222 Nassau County residents died from an opiate overdose (Nassau County Medical Examiner).

In support of the campaign, CASA is providing local pharmacies with free fact cards which list safe practices along with precinct locations where residents can dispose of prescription drugs.
