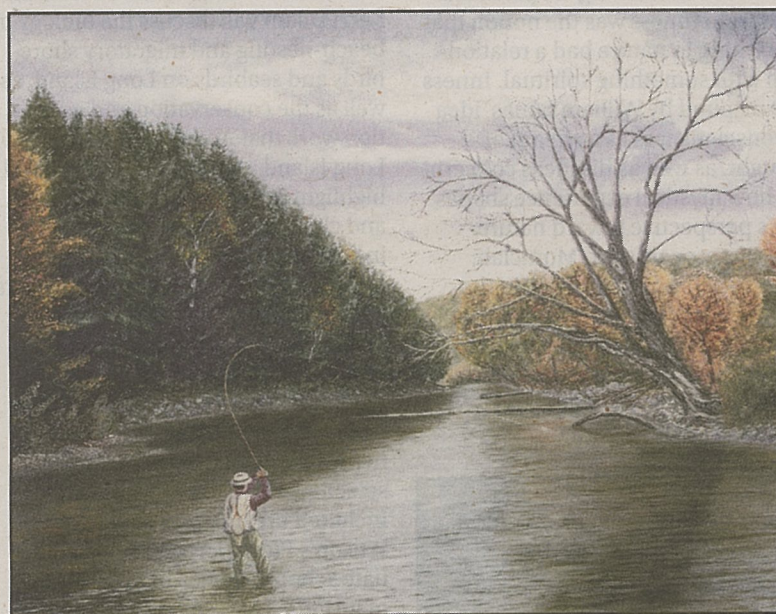
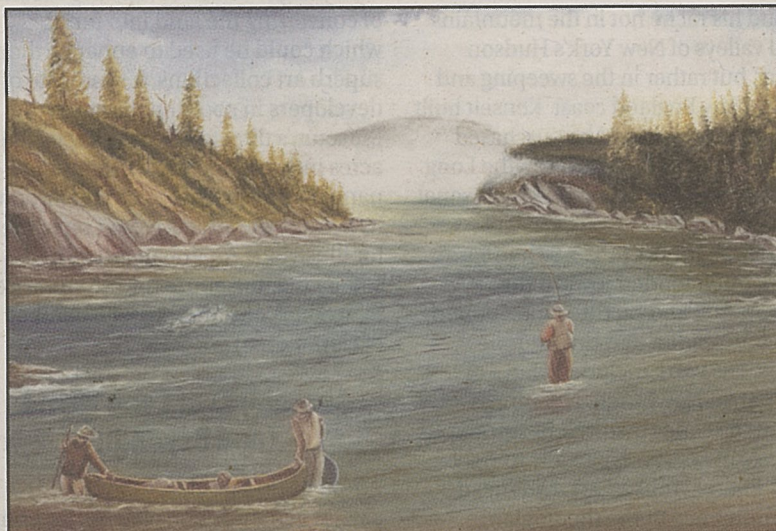
Money In Politics
