Barnes & Noble works with Manhasset CASA & Educates Community to Dangers of Underage Drinking

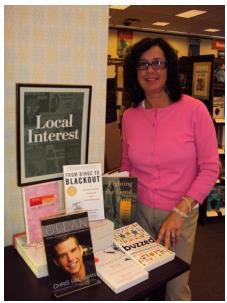

According to the December 2009 issue of the Journal of Psychology of Addictive Behaviors, scientific studies comparing the brains of teen drinkers to non-drinkers found that young alcohol users suffered damage to nerve tissues and showed that teen drinking negatively affected both the white matter (nerve tissue) and hippocampus region of the brain.
