Fall Semester – Time For Discussions About College Drinking

*Colleges required to disclose
campus security policies and crime statistics*

As college students arrive on campus this fall, parents envision for their children a time of new experiences, new friendships, and making memories that will last a lifetime. Manhasset CASA and the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism remind parents that for many, it is a scene of high risk drinking that can turn tragic, where they will deal with its aftermath—vandalism, violence, sexual aggression, and even death.

Addressing the issue head on this spring, Manhasset High School Seniors were educated in the Red Watch Band Curriculum to help students understand the importance of recognizing alcohol overdose as a medical emergency and provide the knowledge, skill and confidence to help prevent a tragedy. The district administration, faculty, CASA, and the SCA, coordinated and implemented the program with the help of the Robbie Levine Foundation through its “Teens for Life” initiative that provided the CPR/AED certification component for every participant. But prevention doesn’t stop there. Parents also play a critical role in their child’s healthy transition to college.

Early Weeks Are Critical

As the fall semester begins, parents can use this important time to help prepare their college-age sons and daughters by talking with them about the consequences of excessive drinking. Some first-year students who live on campus may be at partic-

ular risk for alcohol misuse. During their high school years, those who go on to college tend to drink less than their non-college-bound classmates. However, during subsequent years, the heavy drinking rates of college students surpass those of their non-college peers. This rapid increase in heavy drinking over a relatively short period of time can contribute to serious difficulties with the transition to college.

Research shows that the first six weeks of the first semester are critical to a first-year student’s academic success. Because many students initiate heavy drinking during these early days of college, the potential exists for excessive alcohol consumption to interfere with successful adaptation to campus life. The transition to college is often difficult and about one-third of first-year students fail to enroll for their second year.

Parents Stay Involved

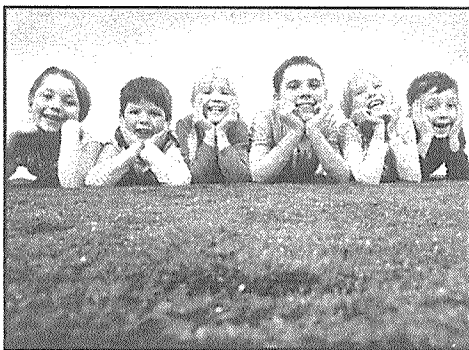
During these crucial early weeks, parents can do a variety of things to stay involved. Manhasset CASA suggests parents:

- Pay special attention to your son’s or daughter’s experiences and activities during the crucial first six weeks on campus. Many students initiate heavy drinking during these early days of college. Excessive alcohol consumption interferes with successful transition to campus life;

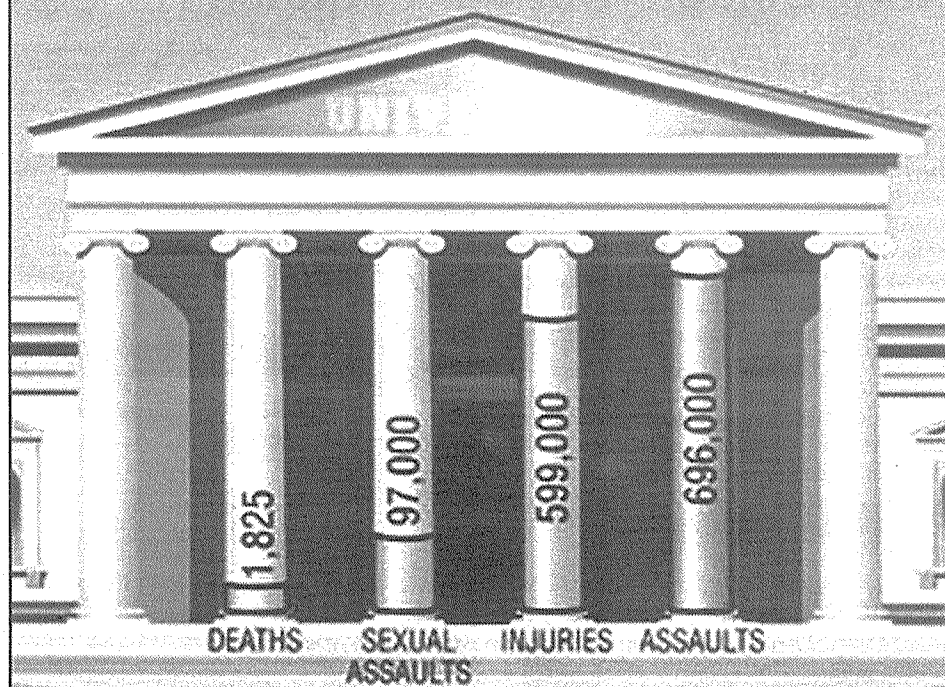

Consequences of High-risk College Drinking

The consequences of excessive drinking by college students are more significant, more destructive, and more costly than many parents realize. And these consequences affect students whether or not they drink. Drinking by college students aged 18 to 24 contributes to an estimated 1,825 student deaths, 599,000 injuries, and 97,000 cases of sexual assault or date rape each year.

- Attend, with your freshman, orientation programs that educate students about campus policies related to alcohol use; be familiar with who is responsible for campus counseling programs;
- Inquire about the college's "parental notification" policy;
- Stay actively involved in the life of your son or daughter. Even away at college, your child continues to be an extension of your family and its values;

- Inquire about their roommates' behavior, and how disagreements are settled or disruptive behavior dealt with;

- Make sure your student understands the penalties for underage drinking, public drunkenness, using fake ID, driving under the influence, assault, and other alcohol-related offenses. Indicate that you have asked the college to keep you informed of infractions;

- Make certain that they understand how alcohol use can lead to date rape, violence, and academic failure.

Help Is Available

For parents who want to talk to their teenage sons and daughters about the sequences of college drinking, a variety of helpful resources are available from NACPE at www.collegedrinkprevention.gov.

In addition, parents should be aware that the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Statistics Act requires colleges and universities to disclose annual information about campus crime and security policies and requires colleges to publish an annual report disclosing campus security policies and three years' worth of selected statistics, including liquor-law violations resulting in arrest or disciplinary action.
